Starting tomorrow, Wednesday October 18<sup>th</sup> and through Sunday October 29<sup>th</sup>, the exhibitions of the eighteenth Rome Film Fest are open to visitors with free admission.

**Simply Anna**

The Foyer of Sala Petrassi at the Auditorium Parco della Musica Ennio Morricone, will feature the exhibition titled “Simply Anna”: for the 50<sup>th</sup> anniversary of the death of Anna Magnani, it pays tribute to a great actress, a remarkable woman ahead of her time, a whirlwind of strength, tenacity and intelligence. On exhibit are original materials, five photos by Sanford H. Roth from the set of the film *The Rose Tattoo* (which won her an Oscar® for her performance) and many letters she exchanged with personalities in the fields of culture and entertainment.

The exhibit will further be enriched with a number of garments kindly lent by Maison Gattinoni, made for Anna Magnani for the previews of her films in the major international festivals, and the costume she wore on the set of her film *We the Women*. *The exhibition is produced by the Fondazione Cinema per Roma, conceived and curated by Stefano Di Tommaso and Francesca Piggianelli. The garments on display from Maison Gattinoni are from the personal Archive of Stefano Dominella.*

### **All the stars lead to Rome. Photo portraits by Luigi de Pompeis**

The Foyer of Sala Sinopoli will host the exhibition “All the stars lead to Rome. Photo portraits by Luigi de Pompeis” which will also continue in the spaces of WeGil, the cultural hub of the Regione Lazio managed by LAZIOcrea, from October 23<sup>rd</sup> to November 12<sup>th</sup>, 2023. The exhibition presents the portraits of great actors and actresses portrayed in the artistic photos by Luigi de Pompeis, the renowned photo-reporter: around forty black and white images selected by the curator Georgiana Ionescu. From Paolo Sorrentino to Juliette Binoche, from Angelina Jolie to Tom Hanks, and including Nanni Moretti, Michael Douglas and Isabella Rossellini, to name only a few, will illustrate the mythology of cinema within the settings of three great European film festivals: Rome with its wonderful carpet, Cannes with its magical Montée and Venice, the oldest film festival in the world, with its splendid red carpet on the Lido.
